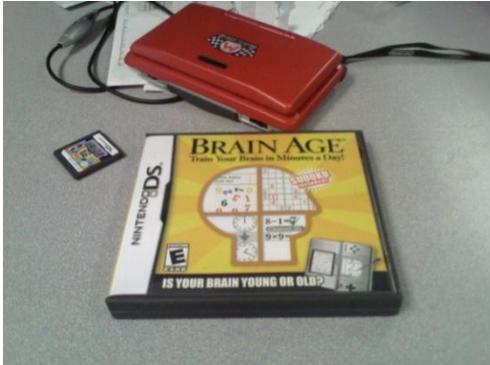


Three famous games

Brain Age: train you brain

This is a game from 2015. It uses a variety of puzzles to keep different parts of your brain active. Some of them are maths questions, Sudoku puzzles and a test that matches colours and names for colours (the stroop test). For many puzzles, you need a touch screen and a microphone. We are not sure if the game really helps the brain, but it helped its designers win many awards.
