PRESENT PERFECT

Change the verbs in brackets with the correct form of the present perfect tense.

The first sentence has been done for you.

I **have** completely **changed** (change) my life. I **have started** (start) living healthily. I **have stopped** (stop) eating sugar and drinking fizzy drinks. And I **have** never **felt** (feel) better! My friends and I **have formed** (form) a dance group and we dance every day. So far, I **have lost** (lose) more than 10 kg! My boyfriend **has seen** (see) the difference in my behaviour, too. In the past couple of months, I **have been** (be) more energetic and less nervous. I **haven't had** (not have) any weird dreams, either. I **have slept** (sleep) better ever since I **have been** (be) on this new eating regime. I **have** already **talked** (talk) about it to my family and friends to help them lose weight, too, but I still **haven't written** (not write) about it on social media.

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS

Change the verbs in brackets with the correct form of the present perfect continuous tense. The first one has been done for you.

A: Luna, **have** you **been living** in this town your whole life (live)?

B: Actually, yes, I **have been living** (live) here since 2007 – the year of my birth. And all my life I **have been sharing** (share) my room with Laura, my twin sister. Unfortunately.

A: Why unfortunately? **Have** you two **been having** (have) some kind of problems?

B: Yes. Laura **has been talking** (talk) in her sleep since she was little. So I **haven't been sleeping** (not sleep) well for the last 10 years.

C: Ever since I can remember, my brother **has been snoring** (snore) loudly every night. Also very annoying! For the last couple of days he **has been taking** (take) some tablets. I hope things will be better now.

PRESENT PERFECT OR PAST SIMPLE

PLURAL
